River Oaks extends congratulations to the following families, and a "welcome" to their new additions:


ENGLISH

We are all concerned with the dangerous traffic conditions at the Ridge Road / Route 59 entrance to



River Oaks. Although the new stop light scheduled to be installed at Route 59 and Mack Road within the next year will help slow down Route 59 traffic, conditions will still be more hazardous than they should be. The Board has sent a letter to the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT), urgently requesting the following improvements:

- 1. T-intersection signs warning Route 59 motorists of the subdivision entrance.
- 2. Reduction of the speed limit on Route 59.
- 3. Addition of left-hand turn lanes and right-hand deceleration lanes at the Ridge Road entrance (every other subdivision along Route 59 has these).

Copies of our letter have also been distributed to the Mayor and to the Warrenville Chief of Police, both of whom have promised to draft similar letters to IDOT.

The next meeting of the River Oaks Board of Directors is scheduled for 7:30 PM, Thursday, August 17, at Pete Molina's, 2 S 510 River Oaks Dr.

We hereby present another in our series of fabulous River Oaks recipes - Judy Molina's Beef Barbecue:

6 1b Beef Brisket
1/2 cup Liquid Smoke
1 tsp garlic powder
1 tsp minced onion
1 tsp salt
1/2 tsp pepper
1 cup water

Beef Barbecue

. . Judy Molina

Cover and bake in a 275 deg. oven until fork tender (about 5 to 6 hours). Reserve 1 cup meat juices. Chill meat for easier slicing. Remove excess fat from meat. Slice thinly across the grain. In the same roaster on top of the range, blend:

1 cup reserved meat juices
3/4 cup firely packed brown sugar
1/4 cup Morcestershire sauce
2 Tbsp white vinegar
1 1/2 tsp prepared austard
1 1/2 tsp celery salt
1 tsp salt
1/2 tsp parlic powder
1/2 tsp papper

Add meat mixture. Mix well. Heat and serve. May be prepared ahead and frozen. Serves 36 to 48.
