Ralph's Painting and Decorating has been contacted for a price on painting the front entrance sign. Ralph's price is the same as last year at \$150. The Landscaping budget of \$7200 will be able to cover this cost.

#### Are Your Evergreens Looking a Little Brown?

The winter combination of wind, little snow and varying temperatures has taken a toll on evergreens this year.

As a result, your evergreens may look dead. The question is, are they dead?

The answer is, it's too early to tell. There is a good chance your evergreens will come back, so wait at least until after Memorial Day before you do any pruning!

This 'wind burn' phenomenon also affects deciduous plants which retain their leaves: box woods, azalea, rhododendron and eonymus are common examples.

Be sure your plants receive adequate water in order to help them overcome the trials of winter.
