The city has tried to fix the problem in the cul-de-sac by cutting back the grass from the curb and spreading paving gravel, which has hardened to a traffic bond. One idea for fixing the cul-de-sac problem was to take out the cul-de-sac and pave the area.

HALLOWEEN TIPS from the Warrenville Police Department

With the advent of Halloween just around the corner, the Warrenville Police Department would like to remind all parents of Trick or Treaters of a

few safety tips which will enable you to enjoy the day.

- 1. Children should be accompanied by either parents or a responsible adult, and trick or treat at only those homes at which you know the residents. Do not under any circumstances approach strangers in vehicles for any reason.
- 2. Children should wear reflective clothing, and if possible face paint rather than masks. Masks have a habit of slipping, and the children in their excitement of the moment may not see danger in the form of traffic until it's too late.

- 3. Costumes should be such that the child has freedom of movement and not cumbersome to the child.
- 4. After dark, adults (and children if possible) should carry flashlights so that they may easily be seen by vehicles.
- 5. Trick or Treaters must obey all traffic rules. Cross road ways only at intersections and use sidewalks! Do not walk in the street. Never dart out in the street!
- 6. This year Halloween is on a Saturday. The Police Department recommends that all Trick or Treating takes place Between 1:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. All Trick or Treating should cease by 7:00 p.m.
- 7. If you receive any "treats" that appear suspicious or tampered with, please notify the police.
- 8. Please turn a porch light on for the Trick or Treaters. If a house has no lights on and is dark, go to the next house.
- 9. Remember to wave whenever you see a Police Officer!
