


# **River Oaks Newsletter**

The next brush pick-up is scheduled for April 2 & May 7, 2007









This year marks our 20th Anniversary! March 1, 2007 is the beginning of a new fiscal year. You will be receiving new coupons shortly indicating \$60.00 due each quarter beginning May 31, 2007. Remember, the entire year may be paid in advance at a cost of \$240.00.

There are some past due accounts for the remainder of 2006 fiscal year. If an account becomes past due there is a \$10 late fee per quarter assessed to your account and after further attempts by the board to collect payment there will be a lien placed against your home for the amount past due along with all court costs incurred in placing the lien. The board encourages homeowners to contact any board member with questions or concerns.







Fourth quarter payment of \$60.00 was due February 28th. If you have not paid the fourth quarter balance please remit as soon as possible.

All past-due payments will be assessed a \$10.00 late fee per quarter.

Still waiting for IRS letter with EIN number too pen CD.



## River Oaks Improvement Association Announcement

There have been coyote sightings in the neighborhood. Possibly with the river clean-up the coyote are looking for a new habitat. Coyotes eat many different foods, including small animals, fruits, vegetables, garbage and pet food. Remember everything a coyote does is related to a potential meal. Here are a few suggestions to make your property less attractive to coyotes.

Secure your garbage! Coyotes will raid open trash materials and compost piles. Secure your garbage in tough plastic containers with tight fitting lids and keep in secure buildings when possible. Take out the trash the morning pick up is scheduled, not the previous night. Keep compost piles in containers designed to contain but vent the material.

Don't feed or try to pet coyotes! Keep wild things wild! Feeding, whether direct or indirect, can cause coyotes to act tame and over time may lead to bold behavior. Coyotes that rely on natural food items remain wild and wary of humans.

Keep your pets safe! Although free roaming pets are more likely to be killed by automobiles than by wild animals, coyotes do view cats and small dogs as potential food and larger dogs as competition. For the safety of your pets, keep them restrained at all times.

Keep bird feeder areas clean! Use feeders designed to keep seed off the ground as the seed attracts many small mammals coyotes prey upon. Remove feeders if coyotes are regularly seen around your yard.

Feed pets indoors! Outdoor feeding attracts many wild animals to your door!

Close off crawl spaces under porches and sheds! Coyotes use such areas for resting and raising young.

Don't let coyotes intimidate you! Don't hesitate to scare or threaten coyotes with loud noises, bright lights, or water.

Cut back brushy edges around your yard! These areas provide cover for coyotes and their prey.

Protect pets and produce! Coyotes may prey on small animals. Techniques such as fencing, will protect from predation. Clear fallen fruit from and around fruit trees.

Educate your neighbors! Pass this information along since your efforts will be futile if neighbors are providing food and shelter for coyotes.
