

Parkway Trees & City of Warrenville

It's that time of year again to look at the PARKWAY TREES IN FRONT OF YOUR HOUSE and breathe a sigh of relief knowing that you will not hear from the ROIA Board to trim your trees any more. The City of Warrenville is taking over all the City's Parkway Trees in town. The ROIA Board submitted a letter voiding the original agreement that was signed by a prior board that committed the homeowners for the care of the trees in the parkway. The City of Warrenville will now take 100% care for the trees. You will still need to mow your parkway and water the trees in a drought. The City will only trim, shape, and remove the dead trees as deemed necessary by the City. You are not allowed to plant trees in the parkway with out prior permission from the City of Warrenville public works department. They have a very specific list of trees. They City will plant the trees for you but you must pick from their list of trees and pay between \$100-\$200 per tree planted by the City. No other tree planting is allowed by the Homeowner.

<u>On a another note, all sidewalks</u> <u>must be free of limbs & leaves hit-</u> <u>ting the public on the sidewalk.</u> This also includes any shrubs that are encroaching on the sidewalk from your front yards. The sidewalk must be free to allow passage of the public on foot or a wheelchair guest also. Thanks for your assistance with this issue.

The next free pick-up of tree trimmings is set for 1st Monday of every month through October. The cut ends must be placed to the street side for ease of handling and the lengths must be no longer than 6 feet in length and no larger than a 6 inch diameter around. <u>Do not park your</u> car in front of any tree trimmings or it will not be picked up; it then is the homeowner's responsibility to dispose of properly. Thanks for assisting the ROIA Board in this process.

River Oaks Happenings

The River Oaks Board has been very busy looking for ways to make the sub division a better place for all to call home. The entryway has been re-planted with perennials and tango marigolds for the summer months. The mulch will be delivered shortly and spread by a "posse" of board members and anyone else who would love to get their hands dirty!

The black letters on the entryway sign have been repainted with a high gloss black to make it stand out!

The lights have been replaced

with solar lights to save approximately \$300 per year on electricity costs plus additional repairs, which ran around \$150 per year depending on the repair. The board is looking into ways to get it more bright light at the sign. Please be patient and know that the board is looking into it.

At the annual meeting it was questioned about closing the walkway between the apartments and River Oaks. The walkway is a part of the Housing Development PUD Plan. It will not be closed. It is an emergency egress for fire trucks and other emergency vehicles. If the main entrance is blocked as has happened in the past with a fire on the upper level; the emergency vehicles could then access an emergency at the lower level of the cul du sac. The City has been contacted to have the Private Property sign removed, which is in the egress right of way. It was placed there by the apartments a while ago. If you are having issues with the tenants please contact the police to assist you rather than handling it yourself. They will be more than happy to assist.

The river's current has ripped out heavy stakes in the lower common area that were in the ground 12 inches deep to hold the new trees in place. The wires and posts have all been removed due to the strength of the river. Please keep your children out of the Common Area Bowls when it rains. If you see children playing in the Common Area Bowls; please alert the parents or call

the police to have them removed. There are 2 drain grates that are the size of an adult that could possibly break loose and the child would be sucked into the drain pipe. This is a very dangerous situation and needs immediate attention if seen. The heavy rains can fill up the common area bowls quickly so please teach your chil-
